

INTRODUCTION

In the years since the amendments to the *Criminal Code*¹ that saw the inclusion of s. 718.2(e), which requires sentencing judges to consider "all available sanctions other than imprisonment that are reasonable in the circumstances...with particular attention to the circumstances of Aboriginal offenders," the Supreme Court of Canada (SCC) has affirmed the remedial nature of the provision in *R. v. Gladue* and most recently in *R. v. Ipeelee*.² Despite juridical attempts to mitigate the overrepresentation of Indigenous people in Canadian prisons and correctional centres, the trend has continued to worsen in recent years,³ and Indigenous peoples continue to languish in correctional facilities in unprecedented numbers.

R. v. Ipeelee has provided Canadian courts with much-needed clarification of the Gladue principles underlying s. 718.2(e), and identified several problems that have surfaced in their application. A related problem to consideration of all available sanctions has been that there are few community and government resources available to provide alternatives to custodial sentences in the community and/or insufficient awareness about the resources that do exist. Without those options for Indigenous peoples in conflict with the law, defence counsel has had limited ability to point to viable alternatives to custody. Both of these issues are rooted in the lack of time and resources available to defence counsel to point out available alternatives for their clients when advocating for the consideration of Gladue principles.

THE PURPOSE OF THIS HANDBOOK

The purpose of this handbook is to increase awareness about community and government resources across Saskatchewan which provide rehabilitative alternatives to custodial sentences, particularly for Indigenous peoples. The manual includes information about addictions and mental health services, alternative measures and extrajudicial sanctions, counselling services, anger management and other programming.

CLASSIC hopes the handbook will assist defence counsel in pointing to the applicability of *Gladue* principles while identifying alternative, rehabilitative programming for their clients. The manual may also assist judges, probation officers and parole officers in the identification of government and community-based services for individuals in conflict with the law. The ultimate aim of the manual is to reduce the representation of Indigenous people in the criminal justice system by providing viable programming alternatives that address criminogenic factors and promote healing in the lives of Indigenous people, their families and communities.

PHEP provides opportunities for individuals to work off fines issued through the Provincial Court system. The Fine Option Program is not an alternative to sentencing but gives people the opportunity to settle fines by doing unpaid, supervised community service work rather than paying in cash. For each hour the individual work, the individual will earn a credit toward the individual's fine at the current minimum wage rate. If the individual works only a portion of the fine, the balance owing can be paid in cash to avoid further consequences. As a Fine Option Agency, they will assign suitable community service work to people who register to settle fines under the program. Take the individual's fine notice to the Fine Option Agent, Melvin Pritchard, at the Operations Office at 33 Foster St. Once registered, the individual will be placed at one of the locations across the city and Melvin will work with the individual to schedule times to work off the fine.

The course includes videos, group discussions, and presentations. The DWI course is a 16-hour course that runs Friday evening and all day Saturday and Sunday. It is held in an informal, friendly atmosphere, conducive to group interaction in 20 locations across the province with a \$150 fee. The \$150 fee can be payable to any motor licence issuer. The individual's DWI receipt will include the name and telephone number of a DWI coordinator that the individual must contact for enrolment.

Offers: Alcohol and Drug Education Program

A second licence suspension due to alcohol/drug-related driving offences and driving related Criminal Code convictions or roadside suspensions may require the individual to complete the ADE program.

- Educate the individual and provide activities to examine the individual's alcohol and drug use and the associated consequences, including the effects on the individual's family
- Help the individual learn about the effects of alcohol, other drugs and the signs/symptoms of addiction
- Provide information about chemical dependency progression and recovery
- Help the individual recognize the need to separate the acts of drinking, drug use and driving

The ADE course is a 28-hour course that runs 2 weekends in a row. The 1st weekend is Friday, Saturday and Sunday, and the next weekend is Saturday and Sunday. It's instructed by addiction counsellors and held in an informal, friendly atmosphere, conducive to group interaction in 3 locations across the province with a \$450 fee. The \$450 fee can be payable to any motor licence issuer. The individual's ADE receipt will include the name and telephone number of the ADE coordinator that the individual must contact to register for the course.

If the individual's driver's licence is suspended due to a 3rd offence for a Criminal Code conviction or a roadside administrative licence suspension, addiction assessment is mandatory. Choosing to drive after drinking may be a sign of an alcohol abuse or an addiction problem. If the individual's driver's licence is suspended due to Criminal Code convictions, or roadside suspensions an addiction assessment may be mandatory. As a suspended driver, the individual cannot simply wait until the individual's suspension term is over to get the individual's licence back. If the individual does not complete addiction assessment, the individual's driver's licence will remain suspended indefinitely. The assessment is conducted by a qualified alcohol and drug services counsellor who

will work with the individual to develop an individualized plan or program that the individual must complete in order to be eligible for an ignition interlock device, special restricted driver's licence or a full driver's licence.

The \$450 fee can be payable to any motor licence issuer. The individual's ADE receipt will include the name and telephone number of the ADE coordinator that the individual must contact to register for the course.

If the individual's driver's licence is suspended due to a 3rd offence for a Criminal Code conviction or a roadside administrative licence suspension, addiction assessment is mandatory. Choosing to drive after drinking may be a sign of an alcohol abuse or an addiction problem. If the individual's driver's licence is suspended due to Criminal Code

convictions, or roadside suspensions an addiction assessment may be <u>mandatory</u>. As a suspended driver, the individual cannot simply wait until the individual's suspension term is over to get the individual's licence back. The assessment is conducted by a qualified alcohol and drug services counsellor who will work with the individual to develop an individualized plan or program that the individual must complete in order to be eligible for an ignition interlock device, special restricted driver's licence or a full driver's licence.

The Matrix Intensive Outpatient Treatment Program [IOP] is a comprehensive evidence based eight-week treatment program with more than twenty years of research and development by the Matrix Institute on Addictions, an affiliate of the University of California at Los Angeles [UCLA] Integrated Substance Abuse Programs. The Matrix IOP program is a structured treatment experience designed to give substance abusers the knowledge, structure and support to allow them to achieve abstinence from drugs and alcohol, and initiate a long-term program of recovery. The Matrix IOP program integrates cognitive behavioral therapy, contingency management, and motivational interviewing which gives individuals seeking recovery the skills and knowledge they need to overcome addiction.

Clients can enter the program at any time. Clients may enter or leave the group on an individual schedule. The structure of the program and topics included in the various components are arranged to accommodate this open structure. The individual's DWI receipt will include the name and telephone number of a DWI coordinator that the individual must contact for enrolment.

A second licence suspension due to alcohol/drug-related driving offences and driving related Criminal Code convictions or roadside suspensions may require the individual to complete the ADE program.

- Help the individual learn about the effects of alcohol, other drugs and the signs/symptoms of addiction
- Provide information about chemical dependency progression and recovery

The ADE course is a 28-hour course that runs 2 weekends in a row. The 1st weekend is Friday, Saturday and Sunday, and the next weekend is Saturday and Sunday. It's

instructed by addiction counsellors and held in an informal, friendly atmosphere, conducive to group interaction in 3 locations across the province with a \$450 fee. The \$450 fee can be payable to any motor licence issuer. The individual's ADE receipt will include the name and telephone number of the ADE coordinator that the individual must contact to register for the course.

Offers: Addiction Assessment

If the individual's driver's licence is suspended due to a 3rd offence for a Criminal Code conviction or a roadside administrative licence suspension, addiction assessment is mandatory. Choosing to drive after drinking may be a sign of an alcohol abuse or an addiction problem. If the individual's driver's licence is suspended due to Criminal Code convictions, or roadside suspensions an addiction assessment may be mandatory. As a suspended driver, the individual cannot simply wait until the individual's suspension term is over to get the individual's licence back. If the individual does not complete addiction assessment, the individual's driver's licence will remain suspended indefinitely. The assessment is conducted by a qualified alcohol and drug services counsellor who will work with the individual to develop an individualized plan or program that the individual must complete in order to be eligible for an ignition interlock device, special restricted driver's licence or a full driver's licence.

SGI will advise the individual by mail who to contact to arrange an appointment. Or the individual can call SGI to confirm what courses the individual needs to take and where. The cost is \$150.

The individual's ADE receipt will include the name and telephone number of the ADE coordinator that the individual must contact to register for the course.

If the individual's driver's licence is suspended due to a 3rd offence for a Criminal Code conviction or a roadside administrative licence suspension, addiction assessment is mandatory. Choosing to drive after drinking may be a sign of an alcohol abuse or an addiction problem. If the individual's driver's licence is suspended due to Criminal Code convictions, or roadside suspensions an addiction assessment may be mandatory. As a suspended driver, the individual cannot simply wait until the individual's suspension term is over to get the individual's licence back. If the individual does not complete addiction assessment, the individual's driver's licence will remain suspended indefinitely. The assessment is conducted by a qualified alcohol and drug services counsellor who will work with the individual to develop an individualized plan or program that the individual must complete in order to be eligible for an ignition interlock device, special restricted driver's licence or a full driver's licence.

If the individual's driver's licence is suspended due to a 3rd offence for a Criminal Code conviction or a roadside administrative licence suspension, addiction assessment is mandatory. Choosing to drive after drinking may be a sign of an alcohol abuse or an addiction problem. As a suspended driver, the individual cannot simply wait until the individual's suspension term is over to get the individual's licence back. The assessment is conducted by a qualified alcohol and drug services counsellor who

will work with the individual to develop an individualized plan or program that the individual must complete in order to be eligible for an ignition interlock device, special restricted driver's licence or a full driver's licence.
